On June 22, 2012, President of the Commission for Protection of Competition pursuant to Article 37, paragraph 2 of the Law on Protection of Competition ("Official Journal of the RS", no. 51/09) and Article 2, paragraph 1, item 6, of the Tariff on the level of compensation for activities within the competency of Commission for Protection of Competition ("Official Journal of the RS", no. 49/2011) deciding under notification of concentration submitted on May 22, 2012 by company Robert Bosch GmbH, with head-office at Robert-Bosch Platz 1, 70839 Gelingen-Schillerhohe, Federal Republic of Germany, entered into Trade Registry of the Court of General Jurisdiction in Stuttgart under no. HRB 14000, through its proxy, lawyer Ms. Srdjana Petronijevic from law office "Moravcevic, Vojnovic & Partners" from Beograd, located at Francuska 27, issued a following

DECISION

I Concentration of market participants is approved in summary procedure created by acquisition of sole control on the part of company Robert Bosch GmbH, with registered head-office at Robert-Bosch-Platz 1, 70839 Gelingen-Schillerhohe, Federal Republic of Germany, entered into registry under no. HRB 14000, over entire property of company Koller + Schwemmer GmbH & Co. KG, with registered head-office at Rotensteig 21, 90411 Nurnberg, Republic of Germany, entered into registry under no. HRA 8491.

II It is established that the applicant in relevant concentration effected payment in the amount of RSD 2.868,547,50 to the account of Commission for Protection of Competition no. 840-880668-16, maintained with Treasury within the Ministry of Finance of the Republic of Serbia, reference no. 6/0-02-380/2012-1, representing corresponding dinar countervalue of the prescribed level of compensation for issuance of decision on approval of concentration in summary procedure referred to in Article 2, paragraph 1, item 6 of the Tariff on the level of compensation for activities within the competency of Commission for Protection of Competition.
